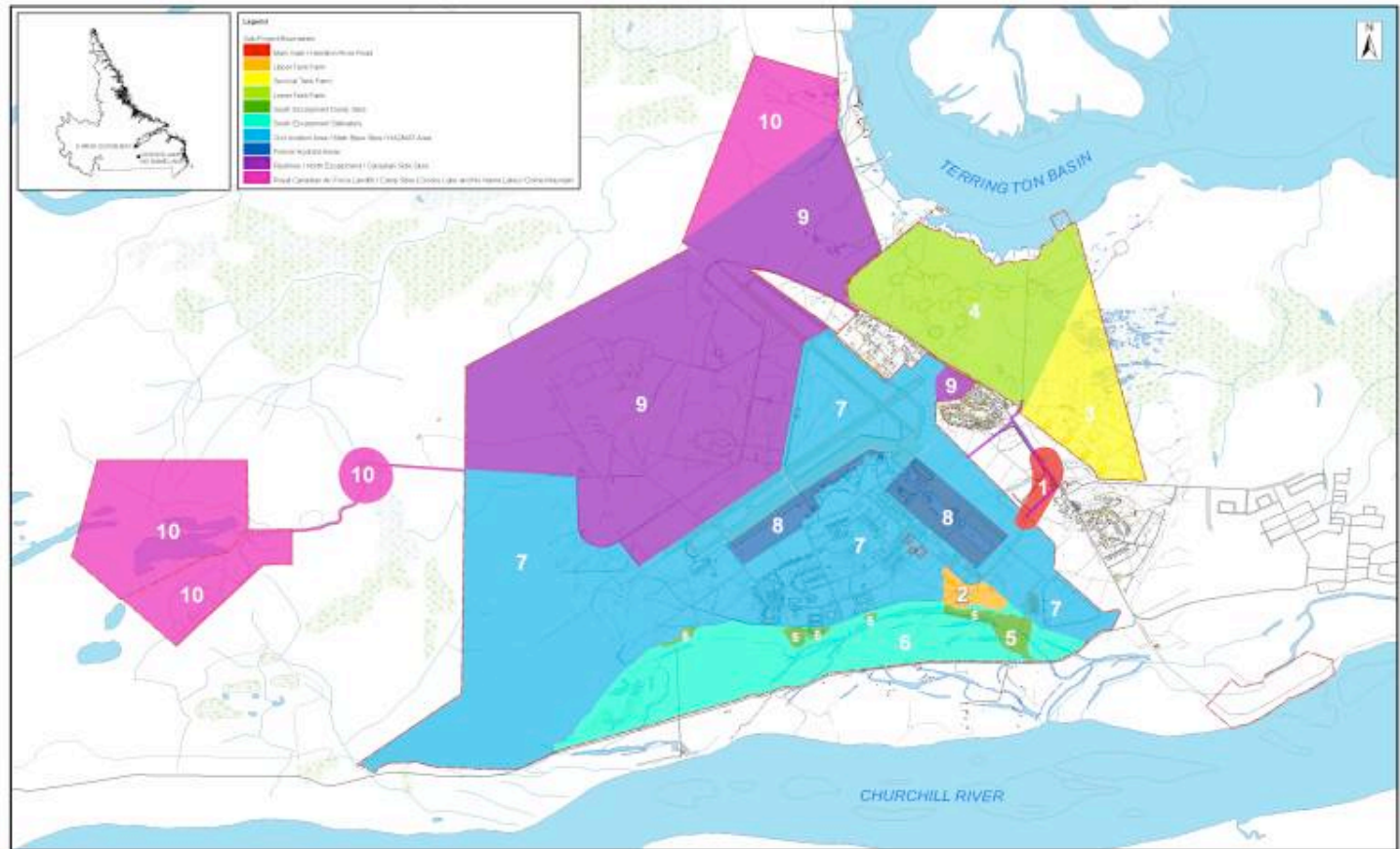

Where We've Been





Where We' ve Been

- **5+ years assessing 100+ individual sites**
- **Developed appropriate assessment criteria**
- **Completed a comprehensive screening level EA**
- **TB approval of project to 2020**
- **Started fuel recovery at 3 sites**
- **Removed >500 drums from around the site**
- **Ongoing dialogue with expert support & others**
- **Determined remediation end-points**





What We've Learned

1. The 10-Step Process is not linear
2. Involve stakeholders early
3. Clearly define roles and responsibilities
4. Risk is a challenge
5. Uncertainty is a bigger challenge
6. Complacency is a silent risk
7. Change is good... innovation is better
8. Procurement can't be planned too early
9. Unwarranted optimism abounds
10. Marketing is important



Where We're Going

- The next 3 years will be the busiest yet
- 8 of 10 sub-projects approved by this summer and either in or ready for implementation
- Last 2 sub-projects for approval in 2013
- Significant number of ongoing or new contracts for:
 - Fuel recovery
 - Soil remediation
 - Risk Assessment
 - Capping & Containment
 - Monitoring
- Continue to seek efficiencies everywhere
